Lay Director's Note

"And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had." Acts 2:44

I've been re-reading the Book of Acts lately, especially the 2nd Chapter, trying to refocus on the practices of the early church, which began as small groups meeting in any space they could. This has been in preparation for leading my church's re-launch of our Life Groups, attempting to build the same kind of nurturing and pasturing infrastructure that made the early church so successful in first caring for and ultimately assisting in their conversion to Christianity.

As I have been studying, I have wondered what it might be like to have had something similar to the Walk to Emmaus back in those very early days of the church, and it dawned on me that they had exactly that! If you think about what we do as a community; how we nurture, support and love one another, this is exactly what those early Christians were doing in their communities of faith.

That being said, and recognizing that our purpose for the Walk to Emmaus is not just to bring people into our PR community, if you think about what it is we actually do through the Walk – the love, nurturing and support we give to the pilgrims and to one another, I cannot imagine how we would not want to use these gifts to bring others into both community, into a possible closer relationship with Christ, and into a Fourth Day that helps to build up Christ's holy church through the development of strong, well-equipped leaders.

We are fast approaching the deadline for pilgrim applications for the Men's Walk, PR61. The deadline is February 18 and we have only one application in hand.

If you have applications and have been waiting for the deadline to get closer, please understand that the board will have to make a decision on whether to proceed with the walk based on the applications we have in hand on February 18, which means we need applications now.

The team for PR61 has been teaming for several weeks, and it is now our turn to support their hard work by providing pilgrims for them to serve. Can you help? Will you help? If you have applications or are anticipating that you will have applications, please contact Doe Breen directly and see if you can work out a way to get the applications directly to her, or at least call her and let her know you are sending them so she can be on the lookout.

Remember, Christ is counting on you.

Spiritual Director's Notes

Perhaps it is me, but it seems that as a society we are blurring the important distinction between talking and doing. I try to keep up with the news, and I am amazed at the amount of talk. Talk shows. Talk radio. Blogs. Facebook. Twitter. Cell phones. iPhones. All these focus on "talking."

But when it comes to Jesus, He both talks boldly and then does some sign to reinforce the bold proclamation. Talking and doing.

First example: Jesus boldly proclaims, "I AM the Bread of Life." Jesus is in another argument with the religious leaders. The talking is in John, Chapter 6. And in case you missed the first proclamation, Jesus repeats this bold statement in verse 48.

John 6: 32-35: Jesus said to them, "*I tell you the truth, it is not Moses who has given you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.*" "Sir," they said, "*from now on give us this bread.*" Then Jesus declared, "*I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty.*" (NIV)

THEN, Jesus performs the only miracle included in all four gospels: the Feeding of 5,000.

A second example: Lazarus is sick and the family that took Jesus in when He visited Jerusalem is grieving. Jesus waits two days. Coupled with a day for the message to get to Jesus and a day

for Jesus to cross the Jordan, pass through Jericho and climb the road to Jerusalem. Four days have passed. Lazarus is truly dead. There is no doubt. Again Jesus makes another BOLD proclamation. Remember that the religious leaders were in discussion over the reality of the resurrection. Then in John 11, Jesus closes the argument with this bold statement: "I AM the resurrection and the life."

John 11: 20-26: *When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went out to meet him, but Mary stayed at home. "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day." Jesus said to her, "**I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; 26 and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.** Do you believe this?" (NIV)*

I found these bold statements and reinforcing actions very comforting. I live in a skeptical world and it is easy to be skeptical about everything. And from skepticism, doubts arise. And in these circumstances, Jesus has an answer. Listen and See. More than just words.

Jesus is the REAL DEAL. I think that may be why so many are offended by Jesus. He shows up talkers from doers. "*I am the resurrection and the life.*" AMEN

Team Selection Chair

The prime responsibilities of the Community Board of Directors are to prepare, support, and conduct the community's Walks to Emmaus. Key to this is the weekend Lay Director, who serves in the employ of the board and is responsible to the board for the conduct of the weekend.

The board selects the weekend Lay Directors. The Lay Director's prerequisite

experience includes serving in community support and conference room positions. The conference room experience requires serving as an Assistant Table Leader, a Table Leader, and twice as an Assistant Lay Director. The Lay Director should show evidence of spiritual maturity, be actively involved in church, and belong to a reunion group. (The latter because the Lay Director gives the *Perseverance* talk that stresses the importance of group reunions in building the Community and supporting future Walk to Emmaus weekends.) The Lay Director's main responsibility is to prepare the team for the Walk.

Team Selection also involves ensuring that the community has a pool of experienced teamers who meet the prerequisites to become a Lay Director. This will be my main effort during my tenure as Team Selection chairman. Team Selection must staff for the immediate Walks and build teams for subsequent Walks.

The fall walks are scheduled for Oct 7-10 (PR63 Men) and Oct 28-31 (PR 64 Women). The community needs both new and experienced teamers for these Walks. I encourage you to consider being one of God's servants this fall and submit your application. You will find applications on the community's website (<http://premmaus.com/>). I will also have applications available at the Gatherings. If you have any questions about becoming a member of an Emmaus team, contact me at bbburroughs@cox.net or at a Gathering. 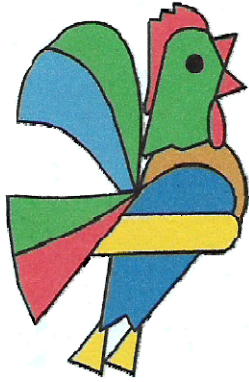
